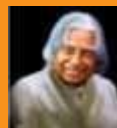

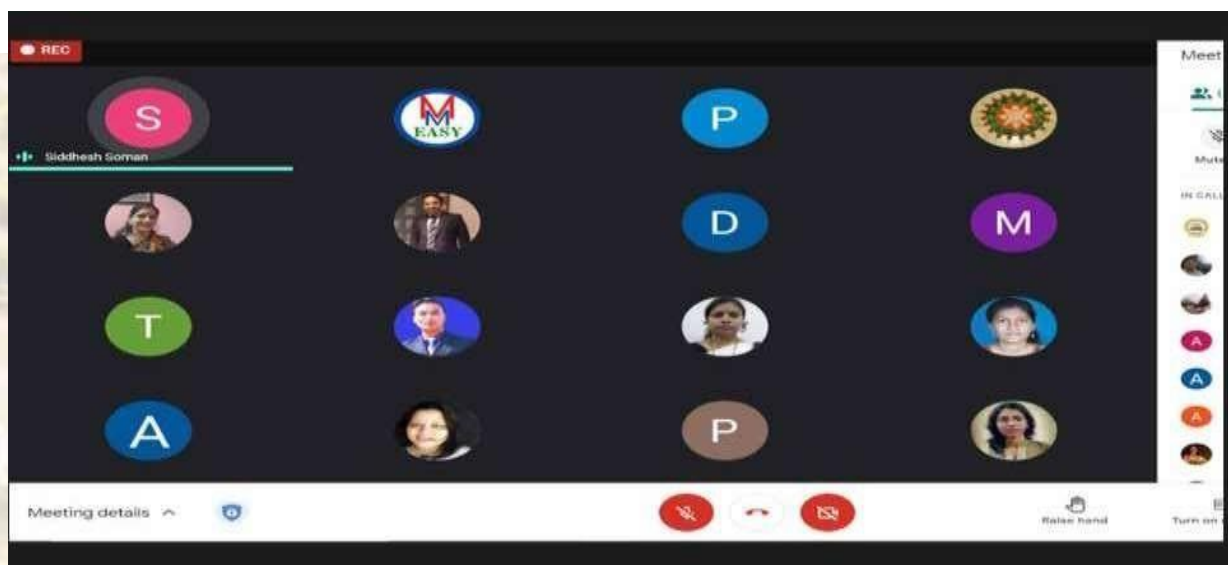


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Online Faculty Development Programme on ICT

Webinar on Coronavirus Pandemic

The webinar provided a scientific basis for recommendations to prevent exposure to infectious agents based on real time, real world experiences as students, teachers, and staff are back to in- person learning. Faculty of Food Technology, Bhai Gurdas Institute of Engineering and Technology, Sangrur organized a webinar on “Coronavirus Pandemic” on May 11, 2020. The panelists presented model programs, presented data on the effectiveness of masking, physical distancing, and vaccination, and addressed ongoing challenges with older building infrastructure, proper ventilation and airflow, space for distancing, compliance with masking, and vaccine uptake. Lack of national consensus on school and training facility safety, combined with state-to-state differences, means that we need to remain diligent about keeping students, trainees, and staff saf
